Musical Thoughts:

Today we celebrate All Saints Day by singing, "For All the Saints," "We Walk by Faith," and "Eye Has Not Seen," as well as "Shall We Gather at the River." The saints in heaven have *walked by faith*, and they *have seen* what our eyes have not: **heaven and the face of God!** A source discussing All Saints Day, suggested that when we look out on a November evening and see the sky studded with stars, we are to think of those many saints in heaven, who are ready to help us! Just think of our loved ones who already have had Our Blessed Mother offer her hand to take them in the presence of her Son. "Eye has not seen, ear has not heard what God has ready for those who love him!" And, "shall we gather at the river, the beautiful, the beautiful, river, gather with saints at the river that flows by the throne of God." First Communion Enrollment
